This gathering is just a little bit different a reminder of extraordinary times we're in throughout our history presidents have come to this chamber to speak congress to the nation and the world, declare war to celebrate peace to announce new plans and possibilities. Tonight I come to talk about crisis and opportunity about rebuilding the nation revitalizing our democracy and winning the future for America. I stand here tonight, one-day shy of the 100th day of my administration, a hundred days since I took the oath of office and lifted to my hand off our family bible and inherited a nation we all did that was in crisis. Now, after just 100 days I can report to the nation America is on the move again. Attorney parallel into possibility crisis to opportunity setbacks and the strength. A single mom in Texas wrote me, she said she couldn't work but she said the relief check, put food on the table and saved her and her son from eviction from their apartment. A grandmother in Virginia who told me, she immediately took her granddaughter to the eye doctor, something she said, she put off for months because she didn't have the money. One of the defining images at least from my perspective in this crisis has been cars lined up, cars lined up for miles and not people just barely ever start those cars, nice cars lined up for miles waiting for a box of food to be put in their trunk. I don't know about you, but I didn't ever think I'd see that in America and all of this is through no fault of their own, these people are in this position.

That's why the rescue plan is delivering food and nutrition assistance to millions of Americans facing hunger and hungers down sharply already. We're not going to ignore that either my fellow Americans look red to come together to heal the soul of this nation it was nearly a year ago before her father's funeral when I spoke with Gianna Floyd George Floyd's young daughter. she's a Little Tikes I was kneeling down and talk to her so I can look her in the eye she looked at me she said my daddy changed the world well after the conviction of George Floyd's murder, we can see how right she was if we have the courage to act of Congress. We've all seen the name of Injustice in the neck of black Americans now is our opportunity to make some real progress. the vast majority of men and women wearing the uniform and a bad serve our communities and they serve them honorably. I know who I know they want I know we want to help meet this moment as well my fellow Americans we have to come together to rebuild trust between law enforcement of the people they serve true. Systemic racism in our criminal justice system and then act police reform in George Floyd's name that passed the house already why do Republicans have their own ideas and are engaged in a very productive discussion with Democrats in the Senate we need to work together to find a consensus but let's get it done next month by the first anniversary of George Floyd's death.

The country supports this reform and Congress should act we have a giant opportunity to bend the Arc of the moral Universe toward Justice Real Justice and what's the plans outlined tonight we have a real chance to root out systemic racism that plagues America American lives. in other ways the chance to live a real Equity good jobs good schools affordable housing clean air clean water being able to generate wealth and pass it down to Generations because you have an access to purchase a house real opportunity in the lives and more America's black white Latino Asian Americans Native Americans. I also want to thank the United States Senate 4 voting 94 to 12 pass covid-19 hate crimes act to protect Asian American Pacific Islanders. she acted decisively you see on television the viciousness of the hate crimes. we've seen over the past year has passed you in for too long. I urge the house to do the same and send that legislation to my desk which I will gladly anxiously sign I also hope Congress and get to my desk the equality act to protect LGBT. Americans scroll transgender Americans watching at home especially young people are so brave.

I want to know your present has your back another thing that's authorized the violence against women act which has been law for 27 years ago. I wrote it will close the actor has to be authorized now will close. the boyfriend loophole to keep guns out of the hands of abusers the court order said this is an abuser you can't own a gun is to close that loophole that existed you know it's estimated that 50 women are shot and killed by an intimate partner every month in America. 50 a month escape it and save some lives my nagged. I did not tell anyone this but gun violence has become an epidemic in America. the flag at the White House was still flying at half-mast create victims of the mass shooting in Georgia when 10 more lies are taking their mass shooting in Colorado end of the week in between. those two events 250 other Americans were shot dead in the streets of America 2050 chateau. I know how hard it is to make progress on this issue in the nineties we passed Universal background checks a ban on assault weapons and high-capacity magazines that hold 100 round that can be fired off. In seconds repeat the NRA mass shootings and gun violence decline check out the report over 10 years but nearly 22,000 below expired receive daily. Bloodshed since I'm not saying for log continued we wouldn't see bloodshed more than two weeks ago in the Rose Garden surrounded by some of the bravest people.

I know the survivors and families who lost loved ones a gun violence I laid out several of the Department of Justice at actions are being taken to impact in this epidemic one of them is Banning so-called ghost guns these are homemade guns built from a kit that includes directions how to finish the fire on the parts have no serial numbers so they show up at crime scenes and they can't be traced the brassy ghost gun kits aren't required to pass any background check anyone from a criminal or terrorist could buy this kid. I was in 30 minutes have a weapon that's lethal but no more I'll do everything in my power to protect the American people of this epidemic of gun violence but it's time for Congress to act as well look A red and blue issue and no amendment. to the Constitution is absolute you can't yell fire in a crowded theater from the very beginning there were certain guns' weapons that could not be owned by Americans. certain people could not own those weapons ever redo change in the Constitution be reasonable. I think this is not a Democrat or Republican issue niggars in American issue here's an else we can do immigration is always being a sense of America let's and are exhausted were immigration for more than 30 years' politicians have talked about immigration reform and we've done nothing about it. it's time to fix it Hyundai one of my presidency I kept my commitments in a comprehensive immigration Bill the United States Congress if you believe we need to secure the Border pass it because it has a lot of money for High-Tech border security if you believe in a pathway this is to pass it over 11 million undocumented folks the vast majority of here overstaying visas we can actually if you actually want to solve a problem I sent a bill to take a close look at it all set to get at the root problem of why people are fleeing particular this to our Southern border from Guatemala Honduras and El Salvador the violence the crushing the gang<mark>s in the political instability hunger hurricanes are natural disasters.</mark> when I was president my present when I was vice president present ask you to focus on providing help needed to address the root causes of migration do help keep people in their own countries instead of being forced to leave the plan was working with the last Administration decided it was not worth it.

I'm restoring the program and asked vice president Harris to lead our diplomatic effort to take care of this I have absolute confidence you get the job if you don't like my plan Let's at least pass but we all agree on Congress needs to pass legislation

this year to finally secure protection for dreamers the young people the only known America's their home and permanent protection for immigrants were here on temporary protected status and came from countries beset by man-made and natural made violence and disaster rows of Pathway to Citizen require workers to put food on their tables plus immigrants have done so much for America during this pandemic and throughout our history what countries support immigration reform we should act. let's argue over let's debate it must act see we truly response restore so of America we need to protect the sacred right to vote most people more people vote in the last presidential election than any time in American history in the middle of the worst pandemic ever it should be celebrated instead of being attacked Congress should pass HR 1 in the John Lewis Voting Rights Act and send it to my desk right away the country supports it and Congress should act now Morkie supposed to last tonight image of a violent mob assaulting his Capital desecrating our democracy remained Vivid and all our minds lives were lost extraordinary courage is summoned dick Insurrection was an existential crisis a test on whether our democracy could survive and it did but the struggle is far from Over the question of whether our democracy will long indoors both ancient and urging as old as our Republic still wide of the day in our democracy deliver on his promise to all of us created equal image of God had a chance to lead lives of dignity and respect and possibility of our democracy deliver the most to the most pressing needs of our people, our democracy overcome the lies and your hate and fears for the pull us apart as adversaries the autocrat of the world are betting we can't and I promise you they're betting we can't they believed were too full of anger and division rage they look at the images of the moms are the salt of the capitalize proof that the Sun is setting out American democracy but they're wrong you know what I know it we have to prove them wrong with the proof democracy still works that our government still works and we can deliver or are people cut our first hundred days together we back to restore people's faith in democracy deliver or vaccinations for creating hundreds of thousands of new jobs were delivering Real Results to people they can see it feeling their own lies opening doors of opportunity guarantee some more fairness and Justice that's the essence of America that's democracy in action our constitution opens with the words as trite as it sounds We the People was time

remember that we the people are the government you and I not some force in a distant Capital not some powerful force.

we have no control over its us it's We the People in another era when our democracy was tested Franklin Roosevelt reminded Us in America we do our part we all do our part that's all I'm asking that we do our part all of us if we do that we will meet the center challenge of the age by proving it to mocker C is durable and strong autocrats will not win the future we will America will in the future belongs to America so I stand here tonight before you and a new invite Flower of Life and democracy of our nation and I can say with absolute confidence I have never been more confident or optimistic about America not because I'm president because what's happening with the American people we stared into the abyss of insurrection and I'll talk or pandemic in pain and we the people did not French Survivor Series were certain we'd Pull-A-Part and fail we came together reunited was light and hope we summon the new Strength new Rizal positioners to win the competition of 21st century on our way to Union more perfect more prosperous and more just as one people one nation and one America folks I told every world leader I've ever met with over the years it's never ever been a good bet to bet against America and it still isn't where the United States of America there is not a single thing nothing beyond our capacity we can do whatever we set our mind if we do it together so let's begin to get together God bless you all and may God protect our troops thank you for your patience.

APPENDIX 5 JOE BIDEN'S BIOGRAPHY



Joseph Robinette Biden, Jr. was born in Scranton, Pennsylvania, the first of four children of Catherine Eugenia Finnegan Biden and Joseph Robinette Biden, Sr. In 1953, the Biden family moved to Claymont, Delaware. President Biden graduated from the University of Delaware and Syracuse Law School and served on the New Castle County Council.

He was elected to the New Castle County Council in 1970 and became the sixth-youngest senator in U.S. history after he was elected to the United States Senate from Delaware in 1972, at age 29. Biden was the chair or ranking member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee for 12 years and was influential in foreign affairs during Obama's presidency. He also chaired the Senate Judiciary Committee from 1987 to 1995, dealing with drug policy, crime prevention, and civil liberties issues; led the effort to pass the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act and the Violence Against Women Act; and oversaw six U.S. Supreme Court confirmation hearings, including the contentious hearings for Robert Bork and Clarence Thomas. He ran unsuccessfully for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1988 and 2008. Biden was reelected to the Senate six times and was the fourth-most senior sitting senator at the time when he became Obama's vice president after they won the 2008 presidential election, defeating John McCain and his running mate Sarah Palin. Obama and Biden were reelected in 2012, defeating Mitt Romney and his running mate Paul Ryan.

During eight years as vice president, Biden leaned on his Senate experience and frequently represented the administration in negotiations with congressional Republicans, including on the Budget Control Act of 2011, which resolved a debt ceiling crisis, and the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012, which addressed the impending "fiscal cliff". He also oversaw infrastructure spending in 2009 to counteract the Great Recession. On foreign policy, Biden was a close counselor to the president and took a leading role in designing the withdrawal of U.S. troops from Iraq in 2011. In 2017, Obama awarded Biden the Presidential Medal of Freedom with Distinction.

Biden and his running mate Kamala Harris defeated incumbent president Donald Trump and vice president Mike Pence in the 2020 presidential election. Biden is the oldest president, the first to have a female vice president, the first from Delaware, and the second Catholic after John F. Kennedy. His early presidential activity centered around proposing, lobbying for, and signing into law the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to help the United States recover from the COVID-19 pandemic and the ongoing recession, as well as a series of executive orders. Biden's orders addressed the pandemic and reversed several Trump administration policies, including rejoining the Paris Agreement on climate change and accepting new applications for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients, although a federal judge blocked the latter. Biden completed the withdrawal of all U.S. troops from Afghanistan by September 2021; during this, the Afghan government fell and the Taliban seized control, causing Biden to face criticism over the manner of withdrawal, with allegations of poor planning. Biden proposed the Build Back Better Plan, aspects of which were incorporated into the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, which Biden signed into law in November 2021.
