

**UPAYA HUKUM KEPOLISIAN KHUSUS PEMASYARAKATAN DALAM  
MENGATASI PEREDARAN NARKOTIKA OLEH NARAPIDANA DI  
LEMBAGA PEMASYARAKATAN KELAS II B SINGARAJA**

**ABSTRAK**

Tujuan penelitian ini adalah (1) untuk menganalisis sistem pengawasan dan pertanggungjawaban Kepolisian Khusus Pemasyarakatan dalam upaya mengatasi tindakan peredaran narkotika di Lembaga Pemasyarakatan Kelas II B Singaraja serta (2) mengetahui upaya hukum dari Polsuspas terhadap peredaran narkotika oleh narapidana serta kendala yang dihadapi Polsuspas dalam menjalankan tugas khususnya di bidang satuan pengamanan Lapas. Penelitian ini menggunakan metode yuridis empiris melalui pendekatan deskriptif. Data yang digunakan mencakup data primer dan sekunder, yang terdiri dari bahan hukum primer, sekunder, dan tersier. Pengumpulan data dilakukan melalui observasi, studi dokumen, dan wawancara. Penelitian ini menggunakan teknik pengambilan sampel non-probability sampling dengan metode purposive sampling, yaitu pemilihan sampel berdasarkan tujuan tertentu. Data yang diperoleh kemudian dianalisis secara kualitatif. Adapun hasil penelitian tersebut mengungkapkan bahwa (1) upaya Polsuspas dalam mengatasi peredaran narkotika di Lapas Kelas II B Singaraja meliputi upaya *preventif*, upaya *preemptif* dan upaya *represif*. Akibat dari pelanggaran tersebut, narapidana mendapatkan sanksi pidana tambahan, dan oknum Polsuspas yang telah terbukti terlibat telah dijatuhi sanksi hukum pidana terkait narkotika dan diberhentikan dari instansi. Langkah upaya menunjukkan bahwa tindakan tegas diambil untuk mempertahankan integritas sistem keamanan Lembaga Pemasyarakatan, (2) terdapat kendala dalam satuan sistem pengamanan Lembaga Pemasyarakatan Kelas II B Singaraja seperti, kurangnya sumber daya manusia yang berkualitas yang ditandai pelanggaran yang dilakukan oleh oknum petugas, overkapasitas, serta sarana yang kurang memadai.

**ABSTRACT**

*The purpose of this study is (1) to analyze the supervision and accountability system of the Special Police for Corrections in efforts to overcome narcotics trafficking in Singaraja Class II B Penitentiary and (2) to find out the legal efforts of the Special Police against narcotics trafficking by prisoners and the obstacles faced by the Special Police in carrying out their duties, especially in the field of prison security units. The research method used in this study is empirical juridical with a descriptive research nature. The data and data sources used consist of primary data and secondary data, which include primary legal materials, secondary legal materials, and tertiary legal materials. The data collection techniques used are observation techniques, document study techniques, and interview techniques. The sampling technique used in this study is non-probability sampling with a form of purposive sampling which means drawing samples with a specific purpose and processed qualitatively. The results of the study reveal that (1) the efforts of the Special Police in overcoming narcotics trafficking in Singaraja Class II B Penitentiary include preventive efforts, preemptive efforts and repressive efforts. As a result of the violation, the inmates received additional criminal sanctions, and the Polsuspas officers who were proven to be involved were given criminal sanctions related to narcotics and dismissed from the agency. The steps taken show that firm action was taken to maintain the integrity of the security system of the Class II B Singaraja Penitentiary, (2) there are obstacles in the security system unit of the Class II B Singaraja Penitentiary, such as the lack of quality human resources as indicated by violations committed by officers, overcapacity, and inadequate facilities.*
