

**PERAN BADAN NARKOTIKA NASIONAL (BNN) PROVINSI BALI
DALAM UPAYA PEMBERANTASAN PEREDARAN GELAP
NARKOTIKA YANG DILAKUKAN OLEH WARGA NEGARA ASING
(STUDI KASUS BNN PROVINSI BALI)**

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ABSTRAK

Penelitian ini membahas mengenai peran, hambatan dan tantangan yang dihadapi Badan Narkotika Nasional Provinsi Bali (BNNP Bali) dalam memberantas sindikat narkotika internasional yang melibatkan warga negara asing. Mengingat posisi Bali sebagai pusat pariwisata dunia, wilayah ini menjadi titik rawan bagi kejahatan transnasional, terbukti dengan adanya 25 laporan kasus dan 26 tersangka asing selama kurun waktu 2020-2024. Penelitian ini menggunakan metode yuridis empiris dengan jenis pendekatan deskriptif kualitatif. Teknik pengumpulan data dilakukan secara terpadu melalui observasi dan studi dokumen, serta wawancara. Hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa BNNP Bali mengimplementasikan dua strategi utama, yaitu: Pertama, *Demand Reduction* melalui sosialisasi P4GN, kampanye anti narkotika, dan rehabilitasi; Kedua, *Supply Reduction* melalui penegakan hukum dan kerjasama dengan berbagai pihak serta pemenuhan hak tersangka. Meskipun demikian, tindakan represif ini terhambat oleh kecanggihan modus operandi seperti modus sistem tempel yang menyebabkan terjadinya fenomena barang tanpa pelaku, penggunaan Telegram, serta transaksi kripto. Kendala ini diperparah oleh keterbatasan bahasa asing, taktik pemutus komunikasi sindikat yang membuat kasus kerap tertahan di status Daftar Pencarian Orang (DPO), serta minimnya partisipasi publik. Sebagai rekomendasi, penelitian ini mendorong adanya audit *blockchain*, peningkatan kapasitas SDM, dan reformasi UU Narkotika yang mengatur investigasi digital secara tegas. Selain itu, kolaborasi nasional dan internasional dan pengawasan keuangan digital menjadi krusial untuk memutus mata rantai transaksi ilegal tersebut.

***THE ROLE OF THE NATIONAL NARCOTICS AGENCY (BNN) OF BALI
PROVINCE IN EFFORTS TO ERADICATE ILLICIT NARCOTICS
TRAFFICKING CARRIED OUT BY FOREIGN NATIONALS (CASE STUDY
OF BALI PROVINCE BNN)***

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ABSTRACT

This study discusses the roles, obstacles and challenges faced by the National Narcotics Agency of Bali Province (BNNP Bali) in eradicating international narcotics syndicates involving foreign nationals. Given Bali's position as the center of world tourism, this region has become a vulnerable point for transnational crime, as evidenced by the existence of 25 case reports and 26 foreign suspects during the period 2020-2024. This study uses an empirical juridical method with a qualitative descriptive approach. Data collection techniques are carried out in an integrated manner through observation and study of documents, as well as interviews. The results of the study show that BNNP Bali implements two main strategies, namely: First, Demand Reduction through P4GN socialization, anti-narcotics campaigns, and rehabilitation; Second, Supply Reduction through law enforcement and cooperation with various parties as well as the fulfillment of suspects' rights. However, this repressive action is hampered by the sophistication of modus operandi such as the outboard system mode which causes the phenomenon of goods without perpetrators, the use of Telegram, and crypto transactions. This obstacle is exacerbated by the limitation of foreign languages, the syndicate's communication termination tactic that makes cases often held up in the status of the Person Wanted List (DPO), and the lack of public participation. As a recommendation, this research encourages blockchain audits, human resource capacity building, and reform of the Narcotics Law that strictly regulates digital investigations. In addition, national and international collaboration and digital financial supervision are crucial to break the chain of illegal transactions.
