Appendix 1. Synopsis of *Danny, the Champion of the World*

Roald Dahl's *Danny, the Champion of the World*, tells the story of a young boy named Danny who lives with his father, named William. His mother died when Danny was only four months old, leaving his father to raise him alone. They live a simple life and run a small filling station and workshop. Their home was an old caravan behind the filling station, surrounded by fields and woody hills. Danny had a very close relationship with his father. Since childhood, he often helped out in the workshop and was familiar with all things engine-related. Although he didn't have the luxuries of other children, Danny was happy to have his father's love.

One night, Danny's father revealed the shocking secret that he had been poaching pheasants in Hazell's Forest. Danny was surprised by his father's confession, but he did not feel angry or disappointed. Instead, he accepted the fact because of his trust and affection for his father. On the next hunting trip, Danny's father went alone and promised to return in the evening. But until late at night, he had not returned. Danny, worried for his father's safety, decided to look for him. He bravely drove the car named Baby Austin to Hazell's Forest, which was quite a distance from home. There, he found his father trapped in a hole and injured his ankle. With great care and courage, Danny helped his father out of the forest and brought him back home for treatment. After the incident, his father was angry with Mr. Hazell and wanted to get back at him. At that moment, Danny came up with a brilliant idea. He remembers that pheasants love raisins and that his father had a sleeping pill given to him by Doctor Spencer. Danny suggested that the pills be crushed into powder and then mixed into the raisins. The aim was for the pheasants to eat the raisins and fall asleep, so they could be caught easily. William was hesitant at first, but eventually agreed to try the idea.

On the night before Mr. Hazell's big hunting party, Danny and William scattered raisins mixed with sleeping powder in the forest. The results were very satisfying. They manage to catch one hundred and twenty pheasants and store

them in sacks, which are then taken to the caravan with the help of a taxi driven by Charlie Kinch. However, the next day, they were shocked by the fact that all the pheasants had flown free. Mr. Hazell comes to the filling station and claims that the birds are his. However, Danny's father explains that the birds are now on his property and no longer belong to anyone. Sergeant Samways, the local officer, is unable to do anything, and Mr. Hazell leaves in a rage. This was a moment of triumph for Danny and William. Their success was not just due to luck, but to courage, ingenuity, and strong cooperation with each other. For the brilliant idea and courage shown by Danny, William later referred to him as “*Danny, the Champion of the World*”.
